The American Recovery & Reinvestment Act of 2009

- \$21,359,800 stimulus funds invested in Oklahoma Conservation
- Funds from 3 Federal Agencies
- 12 Recovery Projects Funded



U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service



- -\$100,000 through the Partners for Wildlife Program
- -Supporting local Burn Associations to purchase equipment





Environmental Protection Agency

\$4,086,500 for 3 Recovery Projects

\$4,000,000 for Streambank Stabilization to reduce non-point source pollution.

\$86,500 Green Roof Project to reduce stormwater runoff and reduce warm season energy demand.

Streambank Stabilization



\$2,000,000 project protects Oklahoma State University property, county roads and bridges.



University of Oklahoma Green Roof Project



\$86,500 - National Weather Center on OU campus.

- -Serves as model to increase awareness of green technology
- -Project location lends itself to research, examination and visitation

- \$1,120,000 Watershed Repair (Seeps, Head Cuts, Dams)
- \$55,000 Watershed Engineering
- \$2,498,300 Watershed Construction Mngt. (Inspection & Engineering Services)

- \$510,998 Construction Cost
- First upstream flood control dam in the US built with ARRA funds
- Protects 6 county bridges and roads

Sallisaw 18 M protects Interstate 40, homes, agricultural land and public works from flooding.


