H2Ohio announced November 2019

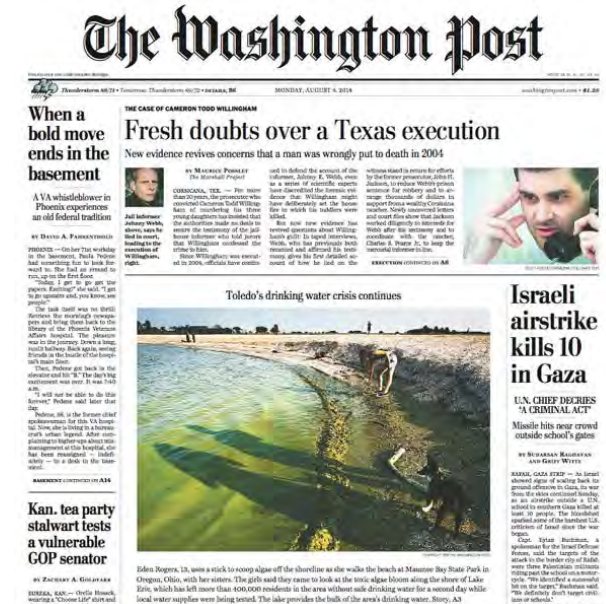
To address water issues

- harmful algal blooms
- failing drinking water systems
- wastewater, and home sewage treatment systems
- lead contamination

ODA's focus is Phosphorus and Nitrogen load reductions to Lake Erie from the Western Lake Erie Basin

- The Domestic Action Plan (DAP) was signed in 2015, and establishes a goal of a **40% reduction** in Phosphorus loads from 2008 Levels

What is H2Ohio?

- Water quality improvement program funded by the state of Ohio. Program is managed by Ohio EPA, ODNR, and ODA
- Maumee Watershed Project (Green) initiated in 2020
- WLEB Expansion Project (Orange) initiated in 2021
- Approximately **1.5 million acres** of cropland currently enrolled across the 24-county project area
- Over **\$120 million dollars** have been encumbered to the project area to date
